

Year Two Newsletter Autumn 2016

Children will be learning about:

English:

This term, pupils will continue to develop their phonic knowledge and spelling skills. They will also be continuing to develop their handwriting skills, including practising writing using the cursive script. We will start the term off by focussing on story books by the author Oliver Jeffers. Children will be writing their own narrative and imaginative stories using his books as a basis. Later on in the term, the children will be learning about Greenwich as part of our humanities topic. The children will have the opportunity to read and use a range of information texts. They will be writing factual reports and recounts based on their visits to Greenwich. The children will also continue to develop their speaking and listening skills through drama and role play.

Reading:

Pupils will be given a reading record and should be encouraged to read at home every day to support their learning at school. Reading books will be changed regularly. The children will have a levelled book as well as having the opportunity to take home a book from the book corner. Reading will be taught at school daily and pupils will get regular opportunities to read together in small groups and individually.

Maths:

This term, pupils will be learning to recognise and count numbers up to 100 and group various objects into twos, fives and tens. They will develop their understanding of place value and use pictorial representations to deepen their knowledge. They will be developing their mental recall of addition and subtraction facts for numbers up to 20, with fluency, as well as using related facts up to 100. There will also be an opportunity to learn multiplication facts for the 2, 5 and 10 times tables, as well as beginning to learn the related division facts. Children will be working on estimating and measuring length, weight and capacity using standard measures. They will also be studying statistics and interpreting and constructing simple pictograms.

Science:

ANIMALS INCLUDING HUMANS:

Children will learn that animals, including humans, have offspring that grows into adults. They will find out about, and describe the basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival (water, food and air). They will also investigate and explain the importance of exercise, eating the right amounts of a wide variety of food, and hygiene.

USES OF EVERYDAY MATERIAL:

Children will identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for particular uses. They will be developing their scientific investigative and recording skills through a range of practical investigations relating to how materials can be changed.

Humanities:

GREENWICH:

Our humanities topic this term is Greenwich Past and Present. The children will have the opportunity to use a range of information sources to find out why Greenwich attracts so many visitors and we will research how Greenwich has changed over time. We will be visiting the Cutty Sark and the surrounding area. The children will be asked, as part of a homework task, to undertake some research on Greenwich. It would be very helpful if you could work with your child to complete this activity.

Computing:

Computing is taught by Miss Charles every Thursday. This term, the children will learn what algorithms are, how they are implemented as programs on digital devices and that programs follow precise and unambiguous instructions. They will create and debug simple programs using logical reasoning to predict the behaviour of simple programs. They will do so using the following: oral/written commands, 2Control, Logo, Beebots, Beebot App, A.L.E.X App and Kodable.

Pupils can also access Mathletics and Reading Eggs for home learning. We encourage you and your child to use these powerful online learning tools.

Art and DT:

Art work will be based around the Oliver Jeffers books and our topic on Greenwich. Children will be working with a range of drawing, drawing and painting techniques using different materials.

In DT, the children will be designing and making their own fabric 'Where the Wild Things Are' Puppets, using different sewing and joining techniques.

During Healthy Eating Week, we will be designing and making a healthy sandwich.

RE:

ISLAM AND CHRISTIANITY:

Our RE topics this term are Islam and Christianity. The children will be learning about Islamic and Christian beliefs, teachings and practices. We will be visiting a local Church.

PE:

INDOOR PE: In Gymnastics, children will be developing their skills, combining different travelling and balancing movements using a range of apparatus. Dance activities will be based around our Greenwich topic, where children will explore and perform different movements in response to different musical compositions.

OUTDOOR PE: For outdoor P.E, children will be developing their throwing and catching skills using a range of apparatus. Then they will choose and apply these skills to invent their own team games. They also have the opportunity to work with a qualified tennis coach this term.

Music:

In year two, the children will have music lessons taught by Mrs. McDonald every Thursday. There will also be a weekly singing assembly for Key Stage one.

Please ensure that your child has a suitable PE kit. The school policy is navy or black shorts and a plain white or blue T-shirt with trainers or plimsoles. Children should bring their book bags to school each day with their reading book and reading record. Book bags can be purchased from the office. Children may also bring a bottle of water, but please do not send it to school in the book bag.

Uniform

Children are expected to wear school uniform. This can be purchased from the office. Please ensure that **all** uniform and PE kit is clearly labelled with your child's name. In general, children should not wear jewellery to school but small ear studs are permitted.
